On behalf of the Board of Trustees, our Founders, and the team at Foundation 92, I am delighted to share our Annual Report for 2022.

This last year has been very taxing for individuals and communities across Salford and Greater Manchester, with the impact of the pandemic hitting people hard, and presenting challenges for people to participate in regular sports or physical activity. Despite this, 2022 was a year of significant growth for Foundation 92 in terms of our presence, our team and most importantly our impact.

16,602 hours of delivery / 8,546 individuals supported / 119,851 engagements.

Alongside our primary focus to support the residents of Salford, we have expanded aspects of our expertise into other areas of Greater Manchester where it has made strategic sense to do so. As with everything we do, collaboration has been key to our success, working with a range of partners, from the public, private and voluntary sectors, both inside and outside of the sporting family. This has allowed us to increase our delivery capacity and expertise in the following areas to meet the needs of our service users.

- Education & Employability
- Community Mentoring
- Health Improvement
- Inclusion, Equality and Diversity
- Social Action
- Physical Activity

In addition to our core delivery strands, Foundation 92 provided a significant Covid response programme, which met the acute needs of our community, and supported those in greatest need to develop their capacity and capability. Examples of support provided, included one-to-one mentoring, targeted family interventions, befriending services, and the delivery of essential packs.

We are proud to support our community, thankful for the help of our partners and our Founders and privileged to impact the lives of so many through our services.

As Salford and Greater Manchester emerged out of one of the most turbulent times in regards to health and financial security, Foundation 92 used the universal engagement tool of football to support over 6,000 individuals to improve their health, wellbeing, skills and life chances, creating and enabling opportunities for the whole of Greater Manchester to thrive.

Geographically, throughout 2022 Foundation 92's main delivery areas focused on the following Greater Manchester boroughs;

- · Salford.
- Manchester.
- Tameside.
- Trafford.
- Bury.

Within each of the aforementioned Boroughs, Foundation 92 is proud to have developed a range of place based, community led, empowerment programmes which embedded the following core operating strands;

- · Education and Employability.
- · Community Mentoring.
- Crime Reduction.
- Health Improvement.
- · Inclusion, Equality and Diversity.
- Social Action.
- Physical Activity.

In addition to the delivery of place based, targeted intervention programmes, Foundation 92, working with partners such as Transport for Greater Manchester and Greater Manchester Police developed a number of interventions which responded to emerging trends faced across Greater Manchester.

Throughout 2022, Foundation 92 worked directly with over 60 individual programme and funding partners. Through such collaboration, **Foundation 92 was able to raise £1,047,796** which was directly reinvested into the Salford and Greater Manchester community.

Executive Summan

The amount raised demonstrates an increase of over £499,000 compared to 2021, which enabled the charity to increase its workforce by over 40 professionals.

Although 2022 was an outstanding year for Foundation 92, the charities delivery team are particularly proud of the development and implementation of the following programmes;


A. Greater Manchester wide family, health, wellbeing and positive lifestyle mentoring programmes, supported by Bupa UK Foundation.





Demographics



An overview.

Greater Manchester's population in the 2021 Census is estimated to be 2,867,800.

This is an increase of 185,272 on the 2011 Census final estimate and represents a growth of 6.9% in the ten years, higher than the growth across England and Wales (6.3%) over the same period.

All Greater Manchester local authorities have seen population growth since 2011 with the highest rate of growth being in Salford (15.4%).

The scale and characteristics of the growth in Greater Manchester's population will have implications for services such as health and social care for the elderly, school places and public transport but will also mean that Greater Manchester authorities funding from central government will change in accordance with these population changes.

The challenge.

Salford has some of the highest levels of poverty and inequality in the UK, with many families struggling to make ends meet.

This has been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic, with many people losing their jobs and facing financial hardship.

Salford and Greater Manchester have higher than average crime rates, with a particular problem of violent crime in some areas.

Educational attainment in Salford is lower than the national average, with a high percentage of young people not achieving the expected level of education.

This can lead to reduced employment opportunities and perpetuate cycles of poverty.

Health inequalities exist in Salford and Greater Manchester, with higher rates of obesity, smoking, and poor mental health.

There is also a shortage of healthcare resources in some areas, which can lead to longer waiting times for appointments and treatments.

Despite all of the challenges the Salford Spirit is strong!

Programme delivery & outcomes

JANUARY



Foundation 92 launched two new Walking Football programmes, including a Dementia friendly session in partnership with Age UK Salford.

FEBRUARY



Young participants of the Foundations sessions delivered social action around knife crime, anti-social behaviour and pollution. With two of the participants winning the Mini Community Ambassador of the Year award at the Annual Power of Youth event in Birmingham.

MARCH



Foundation 92 supported Ukrainian Refugees by delivering aid to the Netherlands and Poland, working in partnership with fellow European club Foundations as part of the European Football for Development Network.

APRII

Foundation 92 supported young people in the Jewish community through the holidays by providing a sports camp in partnership Manchester Maccabi and Evolve Sports Academy. The charity also launched its very own Mobile Hub.

AUGUST



The Foundation took part in the Premier League Youth Summit. Whilst the charity provided over 2,800 free places for young people across Greater Manchester on its Summer Holiday Activity camps.

SEPTEMBER



Co-Founders Nicky Butt and Ryan Giggs with Foundation 92 Trustee Tony Camilleri completed the Three Peaks challenge to raise money for Foundation 92 and Salford Foodbank. Whilst the charities Walking Football team travelled to Germany to take part in the EFDN Walking Football Tournament.

OCTOBER



Foundation 92 launched the Community Champions League in Salford, with over 18 schools taking part in football tournaments and social action projects.

NOVEMBER



Salford City FC players continued to visit schools in the community to meet pupils and provide insight into life as a footballer.

DECEMBER


